COVID-19 and supply issues	Ongoing	PHARMAC has put in place Pharmaceutical Schedule rule changes to restrict the dispensing of funded community medicines to just one month's supply at a time. We are working with all our providers both medicine suppliers and medical device suppliers to minimise any impacts on the general supply chain of manufacturing disruptions caused by shutdowns. PHARMAC will also continue to work with our suppliers and the National Health Coordination Centre (Ministry of Health) to ensure that our healthcare providers – both in the community and in hospitals – have the medicines and medical devices they will need should there be more cases of COVID-19.
